

Sample Interview Questions

1. Who is/are your teacher(s)?
2. What is your favourite thing to do in school?
3. How do other kids at school treat you?
 - a. What do you do if someone isn't being nice?
 - b. How do you know they're not being nice?
 - c. Who are your friends at school?
 - d. What do you like to do with them? (*Explore quality of friendships i.e. are they real friends or just classmates*)
4. When you are in class, what subject do you like to learn about the most? Least?
5. What are your hobbies?
6. What do you like to spend most of your time doing? (*Or: What did you do at home yesterday? Explore intensity of interests*)
7. Who lives in your house? What are their hobbies? (*Explore awareness of the people they live with*)
8. What do you have to do at home that you don't like?
9. Do you ever feel embarrassed? What makes you feel embarrassed?
10. Do you have any pets?
11. What chores do you do at home?
12. Who do you hang out with at home?
 - a. Do you have any neighbourhood friends?
 - b. What do you like to do with them? (*Explore social relationships in their community*)

I interviewed you by asking a bunch of questions and learned a lot about you today.

You don't know much about me yet, though. Now it's your turn to learn about me. You get to ask me a bunch of questions to find out about me.

These pictures are mine. You can ask about any of these pictures on the table or about other things you are wondering about me.

Before you start the interview, I'd like you to tell me about these pictures I brought. (Student needs to I.D. Allison in each picture first)

Why do you think I have pictures of these people?

Review meaning of pictures to ensure understanding.

It's now your turn to be the interviewer. An interviewer is only supposed to ask questions that give information about the other person. There are some words to start questions: who, what, where, when, why, how or do you...

After I interviewed you we talked about my pictures. You can use these pictures to think about questions to ask about me.
